## Method 1)

Go to Other Costs & Income in the Paddock Season View / Tools / Season Costs & Income.  
Freight was previously a standalone data entry item on the Costs & Income window...  
It has now moved to reside under the "Other Costs & Income" button at the top of this window.

## Method 2)

Another way people are getting their harvest freight entered is to

- a) Set up a new machinery item called “Grain Freight” ... when doing so, make sure you choose to cost it using “Harvest Units” ... You can also make it associated with the “Harvest” Operation ....

The \$12 per Harvest Unit that you set up in the Machinery Setup screen is multiplied by the 22 tonnes in the delivery to give a total cost ... this is divided by the total hectares of the paddock for each delivery ... but at the end of harvest you'll get a total “Grain Freight” amount for each crop.
